<u>5. COPAC Report by Jammie</u> – E-School presentation by John Monroe. E-school is available for middle school and high school students in Kelowna. There is also an e-School middle school transition program available. SD23 has now added that an indigenous study course credit will be required to graduate Grade 12. COPAC needs to work with the district and come up with a more stream-lined process for getting work done at our schools. Operations/Maintenance/Landscaping/Garden, etc.

CUPE just voted 99% in favor of a job strike. This includes janitors, operations, CEA's, extra staff, etc.
